Dr. Barry A. Kosmin

Dr. Barry A. Kosmin has been a Principal Investigator of the American Religious Identification Survey (ARIS) series 1990-2008 since its inception. He has directed many other large national social surveys and opinion polls in Europe, Africa and the U.S., including the CJF 1990 US National Jewish Population Survey.

Dr Kosmin has taught at Universities in Europe, Africa and North America. Prior to coming to Trinity he was on the faculty of the Ph.D. Program in Sociology, CUNY Graduate School and was a Visiting Professor at the University of Cape Town and University College Chichester, UK. His leadership of research institutes has included: Founding Director, Mandell L. Berman Institute-North American Jewish Data Bank, Graduate Center of the City University of New York; Associate Director, AHRB Parkes Centre for the Study of Jewish/Non-Jewish Relations, University of Southampton, UK; Executive Director, of the London-based think tank, Institute for Jewish Policy Research

Dr. Kosmin is the author of over 20 books and research monographs and more than 50 scholarly articles in the areas of sociology, demography, politics, philanthropy, and policy research. His scholarship includes being (1993-99) Joint Series Editor (with Dr Sidney Goldstein) of the monograph series, American Jewish Society in the 1990s for State University of New York Press and Joint Editor of the journal, Patterns of Prejudice (1999-2004).

Dov Maimon - Senior research fellow JPPI

Born in Paris, he earned a B.Sc. from the Technion (Haifa, Israel), a MBA from Insead (Fontainebleau, France), a M.A in Religious Anthropology and a Ph.D. in Islamic and Medieval Studies from the Sorbonne University. His was laureate of the prestigious prize "Grand Prix du chancelier des universités 2005" awarded to the best French PhD work in Literature and Human Sciences. Dov worked successively as computer department manager of the Israel National Water Master Plan at Tahal, as managing director of UK and the Canadian subsidiaries of the French conglomerate Compagnie Générale des Eaux and as director of the Jewish-Muslim department at Yesodot, the Center for the Study of Torah and Democracy. He is teaching at the Federman School of Public Policy at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem and at Tel Aviv University. At the JPPI, he is working in the "Grand Strategy of the Jewish People toward Islam" project and leads the Institute activities in Europe.

Michael Novick

Michael Novick has served as Executive Director for Strategic Development of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee (JDC) since 1999. His primary responsibilities include developing strategic partnerships between JDC and Jewish federations. Michael is also serving as JDC's consultant to communities worldwide in the areas of fundraising and strategic planning.

Prior to assuming his current position, Michael served in Jewish federations over a period of 24 years. Before joining JDC, he served as Executive Vice President of the Jewish Federation of Greater Seattle for 12 years and he was Assistant Executive Director and Campaign Director for six years at the United Jewish Federation of Greater Pittsburgh. Michael began his career in Jewish communal service in 1976 with the Jewish Federation of Cleveland, where he worked in campaign management, leadership development, and community relations.

Lluís Bassat

Lluís Bassat is one of the most prestigious and experienced advertising experts in Spain and the world. He has extensive training in various fields: Humanities, Business Administration, Social Sciences, and, of course, advertising. In his long and intense career we can highlight his role in organizing the opening ceremonies and closing ceremonies of the Barcelona '92 Olympic Games, afterwards, he was awarded with the IOC Gold Medal. He has subsequently been a consultant to the ceremonies of the Olympic Games in Atlanta '96 and Sydney 2000.

He is currently President and Creative Director of Bassat Ogilvy and WPP Group President, besides being both a member of the Board and the Ogilvy Worldwide Creative Council. He belongs to boards of major companies in the IT world. He recently just published his new book "Business Intelligence". Throughout its pages, we'll find out that business intelligence is not a gimmick to sell more. It is a way of generating confidence, essential for all companies, all kinds of professionals and all those who need to convince someone of something. And we all are.

He received from His Majesty the Grand Cross of the Order of Civil Merit, awarded by the Ministry of Science and Technology. It is the highest civilian honor bestowed in Spain. He has won over 400 national and international awards for advertising, highlighting the "Best Spanish advertiser of the twentieth century", or their choice as "Best Latin American advertising twentieth century" by the Latin American agency advertising (ALAP). He was the first Spaniard to head the jury of the Cannes Advertising Film Festival. His interest in social issues led him to be President of the Carmen and Lluís Bassat Foundation, dedicated to helping people in need. Expert lecturer, his personal example - as a businessman and self-made man - motivates

David graduated from the Jerusalem Fellows program for senior educators of the Mandel Leadership Institute. He is co-founder of the Zakhon Study Center for Preservation and Transmission of Jewish Heritage and lead a collaborative project backed by Jewish communities and local non-Jewish organizations that successfully landmarked Montjuïc medieval Jewish cemetery. He lectured in Israel, US, France and Spain on Jewish heritage. David is the Founding Director of Beit project.


